**FROM THE HOME FRONT FEU NICANOR REYES MEDICAL FOUNDATION (FEU-NRMF) INSTITUTE OF MEDICINE - Dean Rey de los Reyes MD Class'78**

Warm greetings to all from our Alma Mater, the FEU-NRMF and the School of Medicine in particular.

On November 11, 2022, CHED issued CMO 16 s 2022 updating the Onsite Learning in Higher Education and Guidelines in Transitioning toward Onsite Learning. It recommended that if HEIs opt to deliver their degree programs in hybrid learning modality, at least 50% of the total contact time should be spent on onsite experiences. Laboratory courses along with on-the-job training and apprenticeship programs shall be conducted primarily through onsite learning experience. This was well received by the FEU-NRMF community as we have always advocated for face-to-face interaction particularly in clinical clerkship. As the 1<sup>st</sup> semester of SY 2022-2023 was about to end when the CMO was issued, it was decided that its implement will be in the second semester, giving us time to plan well its implementation. It was well received by the students, particularly the clinical clerks. Currently, 70-80% of lecture and SGD classes in 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> year are conducted face-to-face, however, all laboratory and clinical skills subjects are all conducted face-to-face. In Clinical Clerkship, it is mostly face-to-face, only few conferences are conducted in a blended approach. Whereas before, the only clinical rotation of Clinical Clerks outside of FEU-NRMF Medical Center in the 4 major departments, is only at Rizal Medical Center, starting March 2023, clinical clerks are now allowed to rotate at National Children's Hospital for Pediatrics, Philippine Orthopedic Center for Surgery, National Center for Mental Health for Psychiatry and San Lazaro Hospital for Infectious diseases. Following recommendation of most schools worldwide, clinical duties of clinical clerks in FEU-NRMF Medical Center and in our affiliate hospital is a maximum 12 hours. No more 24-hours duty for clinical clerks and Post-Graduate Interns.

This year our School of Medicine participated in the International Challenge on Emergency Medicine (ICEM 2023) of the Faculty of Medicine of Khon Kaen University in Khon Kaen, Thailand. The theme of this year's competition was Cardiovascular Emergency. This is the first time that our school participated in an international contest of this magnitude. Twenty teams participated from six countries: Japan, Indonesia and Cambodia sent 2 teams, Malaysia; the Philippines sent 1 team each. There were 12 teams from the different universities of Thailand. Team FEU-NRMF was composed four (4) regular members and two (2) reserves. All of them were Clinical Clerks and candidates to graduate with honors on July 28, 2023 at the Plenary Hall of the Philippine International Convention Center (PICC). Dr. Joyce Jumangit, a Cardiologist and Chair of the Department of Medicine, was the coach/advisor. I was with Team FEU-NRMF in Khon Kaen. We ranked tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) overall. One (1) of our delegates, Tristan Robosa, was a bronze medalist, the only foreign delegate with an individual award. Our participation is in consonance with our thrust towards internationalization of higher education. Internationalization promotes sharing of best academic and research practices through interaction between educational system of students and hopefully also our faculty. Other positive aspects of internationalization include improved academic quality and an internationally oriented faculty. Now that countries have opened their borders with the ending COVID-19 pandemic, we are planning to reintroduce the global rotation of our clinical clerks starting July 2023. Our clinical clerks are welcome to rotate in the medical center of the Faculty of Medicine of Khon Kaen University. During our visit, there were medical students from Japan who were having their elective rotation in Obstetrics and Gynecology, Neuro Surgery, Community and Family Medicine and Tropical Medicine.

Application for incoming first year of the School of Medicine for SY 2023-2024 is now ongoing. After the online interview of the 2<sup>nd</sup> batch of applicants on April 10-16, 2023, the list of accepted applicants will be posted on FEU-NRMF website on April 25, 2023. Application for the 3<sup>rd</sup> batch is open until May 18, 2023. The online interview will be on May 29-June 4, 2023 and the list of accepted applicants will be posted on June 14, 2023. Classes for SY 2023-2024 is tentatively scheduled to start on July 24, 2023.

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR : TRIBUTE TO DR. CESAR CANDARI, 1933-2023 Daniel C. Fabito M.D. FACS, FPCS, Chairman Emeritus, FEUDNRSMAF

It is a rare opportunity and honor to pay tribute to a close friend, fellow medical alumnus and fellow humanitarian and missionary.

Cesar is a graduate of the Class of 1961 and board certified in Anatomical and Clinical Pathology with sub-specialty in Blood Banking. After his graduation he pursued a residency in Pathology and subsequently joined Mercy Hospital in San Diego California. He was also a former Chief of the Department of Pathology at El Centro Regional Medical Center in El Centro, California.

During his thirty years of practice in San Diego, He was Field Commissioner of the Licensing Division of the State Medical Board of California for 4 years. He was a Founder and President of the Philippine Medical Association of San Diego and was one of the three doctors who formed and built the Operation Samahan Community Health Clinic and served as its Chairman of the Board of Directors for 17 years. He was active in the “Movement for Free Philippines” with the Late Senator Raul Manglapus, during the Philippine Martial Law in 1972-1986. He also served as President of the Paradise Valley Lion’s Club and joined missions to the Philippines from 1987 to 2002. In 1973, he founded the Antique Association of Southern California which offered Scholarships, Student Loans to deserving recipients, Hospital drive for support and Book drive. He was a selfless leader of impeccable integrity.

Cesar was a very talented person, an orator and gifted with a beautiful voice. He continued to be very active and supportive of our FEUDNRSMAF having served on the Board of Directors for several terms, Executive Vice President, as Chairman of the Foundation’s CBL for many years and regular contributor to our Ectopic Murmurs Newsletter. Cesar was one of the prime movers of his United Class of 1961; Association of Philippine Physicians in America serving as Board Governor and Speaker of the APPA House of Delegates; Presidential Advisers of PAAN. He served either as emcee or performer during our Conventions and Christmas Parties.

He received many awards and commendations during his lifetime which including - Most Outstanding Alumnus in Medicine; One of Twenty Outstanding Filipino Americans; Most Outstanding Alumnus Award for Community service and the Dr. Philip Chua United Class of 1961 Presidential award. He was very passionate and proud of his service to the people his hometown Pandan, Antique having founded the Pandan Antique Foundation where he served as its chairman. He helped the needy of his town during his medical missionary travels and donated a large container with many surgical supplies and equipment to their local Hospital. He donated 118 copies of his first book entitled “Success is a Journey” to the Antique Department of Education to be distributed to the different schools. An accomplished writer, columnist, and author of four books, he was also a pianist, keyboard expert and soloist. He had a three-man band and entertained guests at some local restaurants on some weekends pro bono where he also invited us for dinner.

He courageously accepted his inevitable end and beginning of a more lasting life with our Creator in paradise. In closing, I quote what he wrote as his “Goodbye”!

To all my friends, classmates, FEU co-alumni who did liked me, thank you.

To those who made me feel sweet, hope it will happen again.

To those who share experiences of life, read my writings, touch, or influence the course of someone’s life, stay the same.

To the person who loves me, I love you more.

To the people I have hurt, forgive me.

To those reading or listening, I am so glad you have been part of my life

Life is a song—sing it; life is a game—play it; life is a challenge meet it; life is a dream - realize it; life is a sacrifice - offer it;

Life is love---enjoy it.

He further wrote to me: *“death is simply a sacred door that opens, enabling us to travel to a new brilliant life, the blessed and eternal one, where endless joy with the Lord and infinite peace reign”.*

Cesar lived a full life with outstanding accomplishments leaving behind a wonderful and great legacy worth emulating, which shall live on in our hearts and will be cherished for many years to come by his lovely wife, devoted children, grandchildren, and friends.

Cesar, my friend, Goodbye and maybe someday, we shall meet again!

MARCH 2022 PLE RESULTS

Of the 2, 8887 medical school graduates that took the March 2023 PLE examinations, 1573 (54.49%) passed the PLE exams. FEU-NRMF had a passing average of 77.42%. No FEU graduates placed in the top ten listings. Only one school University of Santo Tomas was in the top ten performing schools in the March 2023 PLE ( with 50 or more examinees and with at least 80% passing average).

The last time FEU-NRMF was the top performing school was in March 2021 with a passing average of 91.76%.
